

## Annual Report - 2009/10



### ➔ Introduction

The Dover District Neighbourhood Forums are pleased to present their annual report covering the period from 1st April 2009 to 30 June 2010

Since being established in November 2006, the Dover District Neighbourhood Forums have heralded a major step forward in the move to localism and neighbourhood engagement giving local people greater influence over their lives, the services they use and the places they live. The Forums involve all three tiers of local government, with Kent County Council, Dover District Council and the Town and Parish Councils working together in order to give local people the opportunity to participate in dialogue with their Members and service providers.

In the last year we have set up an identity and brand for the Neighbourhood Forums which we can build on to raise recognition across the district. In the last year the forums have also worked more closely with other partners including the Police and Community groups, something we wish to develop in the coming year.

The Dover District Neighbourhood Forums and the areas they cover are:

- **Dover Town** - covering Buckland, St.Radigunds, Maxton Elms Vale and Priory, Town and Pier, Tower Hamlets and Castle;
- **Dover North** - covering Aylesham, Nonington, Eythorne, Sutton, Langdon, Great Mongeham, St Margarets at Cliffe, Ringwould and Kingsdown, Ripple, Northbourne and Tilmanstone;
- **Dover West** - covering Denton with Wootton, Lydden, Shepherdsweil with Coldred, Whitfield, Temple Ewell, River, Hougham Without, Alkham and Capel-le-Ferne;
- **Deal & Walmer** - covering: North Deal, Middle Deal, Mill Hill and Walmer;
- **Sandwich Area** - covering Stourmouth, Preston, Ash, Wingham, Goodnestone, Eastry, Sandwich, Staple, Worth and Sholden.

The Neighbourhood Forums help Councillors to engage with communities in a positive and informal way, giving residents an opportunity to meet their elected members, setting up regular two-way communication.

### ☞ **Dover District Neighbourhood Forum Meetings 2009/10**

During 2009/10 each forum has held a number of meetings covering a variety of topics, that have in the main, been suggested by members of the public.

The forums are intended to be accessible to the public, who are given the opportunity to discuss local issues affecting their communities. Members of the public are actively encouraged to get involved at forum meetings, which can take the form of Q&A sessions, large group discussions or smaller table discussions. Everyone is given the chance to

speak and be listened to, given responses and explanations if something cannot be resolved or improved on.

In addition, 2010 saw the introduction of webcasting at one of its Forum meetings. As the forums continually strive to improve and reach members of the community that do not normally come to such public meetings, it was decided to pilot the use of live webcasting at a joint meeting of the Deal & Walmer and Dover North forums in January 2010 where the issue of transport was discussed. Over 50 people watched the meeting live on the internet which was the third highest number for webcast meetings within Kent that month. This is something we hope to try again in the coming year.

We will continue looking at ways to reach new members of the community through different ways of engagement – such as social networking sites.

\* Meetings scheduled to be held in April / May 2010, which would have concluded this round of meetings, were postponed until June 2010 due to the calling of the General Election and observing the purdah period.

The number of attendees at each meeting is based on sign-in sheets. However, this is not always accurate, as not everybody wishes to record their details, and as a result we have measured attendance by way of a headcount at larger meetings.

## ➤ Outcomes

The outcomes that each forum meeting achieves is primarily down to the type of meeting held, some for example are purely information based. However, other meetings cover issues of concern to local residents and more often than not both members of the forums and officers will go away with issues to follow up for the local community.

Examples of outcomes in 2009/10 included:

- Planning guidance given to all Parish Councils and information on services and help offered by Planning Aid.
- At a meeting looking at ways to make a community greener, the Chair and local representatives promised to look into how small batteries can be recycled and how local traders can help. Kent County Council were also contacted for further answers. These were then reported back at the following forum meeting.
- At a meeting which examined flooding and drainage, the Chair followed up the issue by investigating shingles piling up at North Deal and contacted the

Environment Agency who confirmed that they would let the forum know details of patrols and shingle works.

- Also on the issue of flooding and drainage, further meetings were arranged between local Members and agencies.
- An issue of great concern to the local community in Deal was rail transport. As a result of a forum meeting a standing item has been added to the agenda for the Dover Joint Transportation Board and Scrutiny (Community and Regeneration) Committee for news from the forums. A letter was also written to Southeastern with questions regarding local train services. A reply and answers were received which were then sent to everyone who attended the meeting.
- After a meeting on keeping the local area clean and beautiful, an article on unlicensed waste collectors and fly tippers was included in a local magazine which was sent to all households for information.

### ⇒ **Small Community Capital Projects Fund**

KCC allocated £38,900 in its Capital Budget for 2009/10 to the Small Community Capital Projects Fund in Dover. Dover District Council added £45,000 to this figure giving a total of £83,900 to be spent on small capital projects which bring benefit to the local community. Each forum was allocated a percentage of this which was determined by population numbers.

Applications were submitted to the voting representatives on the Dover District Neighbourhood Forums, from all 3 tiers, who were given the opportunity to score each individual application and place them in priority order.

A list of projects recommended by the forums to receive funding was then forwarded to the KCC Deputy Leader and Cabinet Member for Localism and Partnerships and Dover District Councils Cabinet for approval.

Applicants for projects were given guidance about how to submit their bid, and the criteria by which the Fund operates. Applications were particularly encouraged from local groups who had not applied before and were promoted through the Dover District Voluntary and Community Sector Network, as well as other routes. The Fund's main eligibility criteria included the following:

- Grants could only be given to organisations that could demonstrate that they are 'properly constituted'. This includes organisations such as parish and town councils, voluntary and community groups, churches, societies, charities, etc.
- Grants could only be provided to a maximum value of £5,000 to any one project.
- Grants could only be provided to projects that enhance local communities or the provision of services to the public of the Dover district.
- Grants could not be provided as replacement funding.
- The grant support was for the purchase or creation of capital assets. It is not to fund current or on-going running costs.

There were no issues of prejudicial interest and each forum allocated the following grants for the financial year 2009/10.

Subject to agreement by KCC and DDC Cabinets', all five neighbourhood forums will be piloting participatory budgeting in 2010/11 (please see page 8). Application forms will be available in April 2010, and the grants will be allocated by the local community at various community events in September/October 2010.

### ➤ Local Schemes Grants

2009/10 saw the continuation of the County Council funding stream known as the Local Schemes Grant. Countywide the grant had just under £400,000 to allocate to revenue and minor capital projects.

Individual KCC Members put forward recommended projects and a list of collective projects was presented to the Deputy Leader of the Council and Cabinet Member for Localism and Partnerships, Mr Alex King to make the decision.

### ➤ KCC Member Community Grants

Each KCC Member can recommend grants from their allowance of £10,000 to be spent on local community initiatives or projects. A summary for each Member is shown in **Appendix 2**. The type of project supported in 2009/10 varied greatly, examples include:

- The London Road Community Forum who received a grant from two of our members for their 'Empty Shop Front Project': a project which aims to improve the appearance of Dover's town Centre by decorating the windows and shop fronts of commercial premises that are currently subject to disrepair.
- Two Members also supported the Deal Blades Fencing Club who required funding in order to run their 'Deal Children's Project' which aims to run classes for Deal children (particularly those with disabilities) to learn fencing during the school holidays.
- An application received from the TCHG Foundation for funding towards 'The Old Park MASH' was supported by 2 Members. This project was for a summer programme of constructive activity sessions in sport and music for young people, with the aim of encouraging younger people off the streets and into a safer environment.
- Finally, the Eastry Twinning Association received funding towards Kentish souvenirs for two official visits, including one on Armistice Day to Longpré-les-Corps-Saints which will help to cement the growing camaraderie developing between the old soldiers of Longpré and Eastry.

### ➤ Participatory Budgeting in Dover

Participatory budgeting (PB) directly involves the local community in making recommendations on how specific public budgets should be allocated, with the aim of engaging residents and community group representatives. This process of allocating funds aims to increase transparency, accountability, understanding and social inclusion in local government affairs.

For the first time within the Dover District we piloted the use of participatory budgeting in 2009/10 to allocate the grants of Cllr Steve Manion in the Dover North ward. By combining both his Member Community Grant and Local Schemes Grant allocation there was a total pot of £19,371 for the local community to allocate to projects benefitting the local area.

All applications to Cllr Manion's Member Community Grant and Local Schemes Grant in 2009/10 were decided by the local community at a public event held on the 21<sup>st</sup> November 2009. Applicants were asked to give a 3 minute presentation on their bid which was then scored by members of the community. At the end of the event all the scores were totalled giving a final list of successful applicants. As only two applicants were unsuccessful, those who had been awarded funding were asked if they would like to 'give back'; where they were invited to give a small amount of the funding they had received back in order to fund the other 2 organisations. Many applicants were happy to do this and as a result nobody left empty handed.

The day itself was very successful and the feedback all positive. By allowing the local community to decide for themselves how grant money should be allocated within their own area there was a real feeling of community democratic engagement – people felt that they had the power to decide how money was spent in their own area. The event was also a good networking opportunity for the community to learn about projects in their area and to celebrate the work that many of these organisations are doing in the Dover North Ward.



## ➤ Conclusion and the Way Forward

The Neighbourhood Forums have improved community engagement in the district but we need to build on this and look for ways to improve how we involve local people and communities in decisions affecting them. It is imperative that the forums become more flexible and responsive to local needs.

As the forums need to continually evolve, the time is right to evaluate the successes of the forums so far but also to look at the ways in which they could be improved. It is imperative to reflect on what we have learnt in the last three years, consider where improvements can be made and where Dover can again lead the way within Kent in community engagement, whilst reflecting the national framework.
