HERITAGE LOTTERY FUND APPLICATION

Mrs Madylene Outen, has joined the Guildhall Project Team on a part time six month contract as Heritage Development Officer. Amongst other jobs Mady will primarily develop the areas of the project to form part of the Stage 1 "Guildhall" Heritage Lottery Fund bid, working with Project Officers from Dover District Council.

As the Guildhall is in good condition, is not a building considered to be 'at risk' and does not require extensive refurbishment, the Heritage Lottery Fund are most interested in seeing how the building and artefacts can be used to support the community, to reach more people and to attract a greater variety of visitors. Ensuring works to the building increase accessibility, protect our Heritage, and that we develop a strong outreach programme of Heritage Activities are definitely our strong points. Mady has been exploring options for the Guildhall which include:

- Expansion of the Museum
- A Gallery
- Improving the Archives
- Building tours
- Heritage outreach activities
- Conservation and display of artefacts

Contact has been made with local groups and schools, and partnerships are being formed. Input from the local community is vital, and their ideas will shape the project. If you would like to be involved, please contact Mady via the Town Council.

As a result of feedback received during consultation carried out earlier in the year by Hannah Batley with current building users, Mady has been working on the creation of a number of potential options for how the building could work better for its users. Consultants have been appointed to carry out a building condition survey and Business Plan which will both support this area of the project.

Timescales for the submission of a funding application to the Heritage Lottery Fund are to be agreed by the Funder, but Sandwich Town Council Officers and Dover District Council Officers are working together to prepare a draft application for discussion with the HLF by the end of September, with an application to be made by the end of the year. The whole application process can take up to 18 months.

MUSEUM UPDATE

Since its opening in May the Museum and its volunteers have been busy inviting visitors through its doors. In May and June, the museum had 2,750 visitors and hosted group visits.

On Wednesday 21st June the Sandwich 1st Brownies were given a tour of the museum, made their very own Magna Cartas and handled real museum objects including a roman jug and Victorian era spectacles. The Brownies said their visit was a "Fun packed evening full of activities and learning"

On Sunday 16th July the museum welcomed descendants of the Jewish Refugees who came to Sandwich during 1939 to flee Nazi persecution in Germany. The visit was organised by Stephen Nelken and local author Clare Ungerson whose book 'Four Thousand Lives: the rescue of German Jewish men to Britain, 1939' covers the history of the event. The visitors came to the museum for a tour and to see a slideshow of photographs from the Kitchener Camp from the archives collection. They brought their own documents and photos to be scanned and added to the collection, which will form part of a special exhibition in early 2018.

On Sunday 23rd July, the Facebook group Nostalgic Sandwich and Surrounding Villages started off their day of festivities with a trip to the museum organised by one of the museum volunteers Carole Philpott.
