Section 1: Principles Of The Armed Forces Covenant

- 1.1 We Dover District Council will endeavour in our business dealings to uphold the key principles of the Armed Forces Covenant, which are:

 - in some circumstances special treatment may be appropriate especially for the injured or bereaved.
