

# Consultation Report for Cowdray Square Playpark

## Summary

Dover District Council has undertaken a consultation with the local community, at the request of local ward councillors, to get an idea of the need for a playpark in Cowdray Square. The consultation has allowed us to gain the opinion of residents or the type of equipment and facilities they would like to see put into the area.

## Background

Local councillors approached the community services team after residents in the local vicinity of Cowdray Square raised concerns over the current playpark in Cowdray Square. After meetings between DDC and local councillors, a community engagement event was held in the play park to consult local residents on what they felt the space should be used for. The consultation included questions around the age the equipment should be aimed at, types of equipment, and areas to benefit the local wildlife.

The consultation included the production of a questionnaire, which was circulated to residents prior to the event for them to complete online, as well as copies available at the event.

## **Results and Recommendations**

#### Summary of results -

There were two hundred and forty-nine respondents to the Cowdray Square Play Park consultation questionnaire.

- 241 respondents would like to see improved equipment in the play park
- 7 respondents would not like a new park
- 29 respondents think equipment should be for ages 5 and under
- 95 respondents think the equipment should be aimed at age 5-12
- 3 respondents think equipment should be for ages 13+
- 121 respondents would like equipment for all ages
- 182 respondents would like to see outdoor gym equipment

#### Other ideas and recommendations for the green space included -

- Wildflower area
- Green area with picnic benches
- Dog exercise area
- Community orchard
- Community garden
- Woodland area
- Slides
- Swings
- Zipwire
- CCTV instillation over the park
- Rubbish bins
- Better access gates to the park and green space

- Goal posts for football
- Multi sports mugger
- Disability friendly equipment
- Dog waste bins

### Other suggestions that we had from the community -

A local community group, Mill Hill community forum, would like to support local residents in setting up a 'friends of Cowdray Square' group were residents would come together to look after the community garden and orchard. Support has also been offered from another local community group, Pick Deal Clean, who have offered to support the local residents with keeping the park clean and tidy of litter.

## Conclusion

Valuable information has been gathered from the community, which can be used to help inform the design brief for the new play space in Mill Hill's electoral ward. The community and the young people locally are now aware of the project and are very excited.




### Q2 What age should the equipment be aimed at?



### Q4 Would you be interested in a community garden area?








# Q6 Would you like to see a wildflower area in part of the park, which would be cut annually?


### Q7 Would you be interested in a green meeting space with benches?







### Q8 Would you like to see a wooded area?




